- → Books by Mail launched January 3, 2022
- → Currently 91 active patrons
- → Oldest patron was born in 1923; youngest in 2020
- → 73 patrons considered Senior Citizens (age 62+)
- → Of those, 40 patrons do not have an email address or use the internet

Books by Mail Stats

As of October 31, 2023, Books by Mail has:

- ✓ Mailed 712 totes
- ✓ Circulated 4,538 items
- ✓ Spun off the Books to Go program which provides bulk lending to agencies serving or housing older adults such as nursing homes, assisted living facilities, and senior apartments

Also in October, Books by Mail out-circulated five libraries.






Backpack Distribution

Distributed 90 backpacks filled with school supplies to the CiTi BOCES Migrant Education Program students








One Book, OWWL Kids

> 41 libraries participated in our 2nd annual Community Read program






OWWL Library System Book Fairy

33 libraries participated in system-sponsored The Great Give Back project, collecting personal care items for community members in need








Aunt Flow Partnership Program




What's Next?


- ✓ Augmentative & Alternative Communication (AAC) tools in libraries for patrons who are nonverbal or difficult to understand

- ✓ Support 2024 Voter Registration initiatives in libraries





Bilingual Easy Readers
