• Reminder: Library Advocacy Day, Mar 1. Those libraries sending at least one representative will have a chance on winning one of three gently used book carts.

Advocacy is a marathon not a sprint. The Governor's 2011-12 budget proposal includes a 10% cut to library funding—bringing funding below 1994 levels. NYLAs top priorities: asking that library aid not be targeted disproportionately; make permanent library system supplemental aid; and allow construction grants to be used to purchase vacant land as well as lower local match to 25% of project costs for libraries in high need areas. eBook Reader how it functions now and what the future may bring

Highlights:

- B&N have 3 models: original NookWiFi, Nook 3G+WiFi, and the recent Nook Color
- Nook Color has a web browser and other applications (games, Pandora web radio)

- WiFi Nooks are e-Ink technology (like paper, can read in full sunlight), Color Nook has a LCD screen (can read in dark)
- Register your device with B&N and have account # and password; also need to create an Adobe ID (same email as your B&N account)
- Free Fridays offers a free selection to download. Choices are different genres each week.
- OverDrive materials cannot be downloaded directly to Nook, they must be downloaded to a PC, then "side loaded" to the Nook
- Last page open is auto bookmarked upon closing book. Manual bookmarking is a feature.
- Book text is "re-flowable" to fit the screen and can be resized.
- On screen keyboard, built in dictionary.
- Some purchased titles can be lent to another user for 14 days; but only 1 loan per book is allowed
- Audio player on NookColor allows reading and listening at same time; some children's titles have a "Read to Me" feature. No text to speech at this time.

Some challenge to libraries as a multi-user:

- Need credit card to set up account
- Policy is up to 6 nooks on one account
- Unique email for each account
- Currently no extended warranty for multi-users, if you've already purchased an extended warranty, you can get reimbursed
- No definitive policy on how to handle battery replacement when NookColor no longer under warranty

Multi-use positives:

- Can have each account be for a different genre
- Can have different colors—wallpaper, frames, covers—for different uses
- Nook does video MP4 format. Can use for storytime, speakers, author programs.
- Some children's books have read to me feature built in
- OWWL2go to PC and then to Nook
- In the near future apps
- Airplane mode turned on saves battery power
- Original has replaceable battery, default of 1500 books, can use memory card.
