- Library Advocacy Day is March 6, 2012. A letter will be going out week of Nov 21 to library friends' groups asking for their help in funding the charter bus to Albany.
- Assembly Public Hearing, Albany on Nov 29 seeking testimony on the impact the 2011-12 State budget has had on public libraries across NYS. NYLA is sending out a survey about libraries giving help to those looking for jobs. Michael Borges will pull together the feedback and share at the hearing.
- Re: Tax Cap. DLD sent email to NYLINE list saying that libraries should expect to receive a letter and/or email requiring them to fill out a form issued from the Comptroller. - Uses music, art/images, lullaby's, bells/noise shakers, scarves (peek-a-boo), books, and flannel boards

Cheryl Gravelle attended:

- Jerry Nichols *I STILL don't want to talk about it*; personnel issues/handling conflict. Tip: "act like a boss, even if you don't feel like one"—remember you are the boss
- Everything E-Books; (Pioneer seems up-to-date on this topic)
- Sensitive & effective intervention techniques to use in a library setting
- Kim Bolan Cullin 21 more ideas for 21st Century Libraries
 - How libraries are relevant in the community
 - Turnover rate in libraries get rid of stuff that is stale
 - Showcased cutting-edge library in the Netherlands
- Favorite program: *Futureproofing your library* OCLC's George Needham changing library environment; make things as simple as possible, intuitive, get rid of jargon, showed inspiring pictures & Cheryl intends to implement some of the ideas

- Sensitive & effective intervention techniques tools and techniques to use in library setting
- All on the Same Page: Boards-Friends-Director Relationships. Tip: Have memoranda of understanding and review it with your Friends Group every year.
- Throw the Bums Out a workshop on weeding. Reaffirms and reminds of what Ellen has been saying.
- Anna's favorite workshop: *Reimagining Existing Library Space* good ideas for moving things around; giving clear lines of sight; furniture on wheels a plus; possibilities

Diana Thorn attended:

- ABCs of Fundraising with Ron Barrows.
 - Exchange Relationship is a triangle. Giver, library, patron
 - 1st determine your need and be specific
 - Explain why someone should give
 - Decide ahead of time who will ask the community
 - Online is the future for getting donors**
 - Always say thank you, even after an annual letter campaign
 - Evaluate the fundraiser
