Highlights

- Each county has an ARC office and the only Autism Center is located in Ontario County; contact the Autism Center first to work towards collaboration with your county's ARC
- Most children diagnosed after the age of 3
- Autism Spectrum Disorders can include: speech delays, inflexible adherence to routines/rituals, lack of social and emotional reciprocity, hypo or hypersensitivity to overstimulation
- Libraries can make small adjustments to their environment and/or programming that will be more welcoming, may help alleviate anxieties of those with ASD, and help ensure a successful library visit for all—child, siblings and the whole family.
 - o Provide information ahead of time that lets the child know what to expect , can be in the form of a social story board
 - Schedules and visuals are important; visual timers help illustrate how long story hour is
 - Provide materials such as games (Respond, Social Skills), books (see resource list), sensory basket (toy called Tangles is very popular with everyone at Caledonia)
 - Organized activities such as trading cards, Legos, computer game (i.e. Minecraft)
 - Provide a cool down room, so child can be in an area with minimal stimulation (bright lights, movement & noise of other people can be too much)
- Contact ARC to co-sponsor training held at the library and get help evaluating and setting up areas for a successful library visit
- April is Autism Awareness Month, set up displays with materials available at the library or special programming
- Theme kits, as suggested by Pioneer's COSAC committee, are being developed to address themes of: safety at home for seniors, early literacy, jobs, and one kit will be about Autism
- Pat (VIC) asked today's speakers to review materials in the OWWL catalog to see what is available and if there are areas that need improvement or have outdated information
