#### Betsy (PLS)

- Conclusions from the OWWL2go survey: 15% of the 161 survey respondents rarely visit the library, of the rare visitors, 75% get their needs met by OWWL2go, Kindle is the most popular eBook reader, and eBooks are more frequently downloaded than audiobooks
- 120 libraries have ordered mouse pads, but 150 orders are needed to get the discount. She will check to see the cost per pad for the lesser amount

#### Aaron (PLS)

- We viewed a PowerPoint on Age Protect. The following conclusions were noted: Without Age Protect, when an item is checked in, it will fill holds at the **Check-In** library first, after that it will fill holds for any other library in oldest first order and items return home only after all holds are filled **OR** they happen to be targeted to fill a hold at the home library. With Age Protect, when an item is checked in, it will be targeted to fill holds at the **Owning Library** no matter where it is checked in, if there are no holds at the owning library it will return to the shelf at the owning library and items will fill holds outside the owning library **Only** after Age Protect expires (2 months after copy create date) or when it is removed. ## **Geek the Library**

### **Highlights:**

- Geek the Library is a community awareness campaign designed to highlight the vital role of public libraries and educate the public about the critical funding issues many libraries face.
- Funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the goal of this campaign is to connect with and educate library supporters who don't necessarily visit the library often, or at all.
- Geek the Library was originally a pilot program but has been so successful that it will run through 2015
- It is a free program
- This initiative drives new members to the library and friends groups and shows why libraries are important to their communities.
- You do not need a huge budget to promote this campaign and many small, rural libraries use Geek
- The program typically runs 6-12 months
- A launch kit is sent to each library which includes stickers, T shirts, posters etc.
- There are certain requirements: sit in on a 1-hour webinar, activate your CMC (Campaign Management Center) account, complete a short survey (10 questions), notify them when you start and end your campaign.
- This campaign takes libraries into the community and when you increase awareness, you change behavior.

- The objectives of the campaign are as follows: to have 1,000 locations by 6/2015, to engage staff and increase advocacy, to obtain feedback
- They will give campaign support in every way possible. Two additional kits will be sent after the initial launch kit.
