To leverage the power of food to end hunger and build healthier communities.






Our vision

Who we serve ...




We serve as a regional food bank, distributing food to a network of hundreds of nonprofits throughout 10 counties in the Rochester area.

What is Food Insecurity?

According to the USDA ...


 Based on survey data, food insecurity is a "household-level economic and social condition of <u>limited or uncertain access to adequate food</u>."


- Hunger, meanwhile, is an individual-level
 physiological condition that may result from food insecurity.
- Within Foodlink's 10-county service area, 12.2% of the population (152,730 people) live in a food-insecure household in 2021 – a 10% increase compared to 2019 (pre-pandemic).

Food insecurity is everywhere

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
2021 Projected Overall Food Insecurity Rate

Food insecurity rate by census tract **City of Rochester**





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Food insecurity does not impact everyone equally

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
Food insecurity impacts healthcare costs

Foodlink's role as both a food bank & a public health organization

Serve as the hub of the emergency food system

 Help households access healthy food through our members (e.g. food pantries, meal programs & shelters)



Address the root causes of hunger in our communities

 Create and implement programs that aim to "state the line" rath the need.

Foodlink initiatives that address some of the "root causes" of food insecurity

Community Health Education empowers people with **food**

literacy skills and the information they need to make healthy choices.

Foodlink Career Fellowship

trains people who experienced barriers to employment for middle-skills jobs with **a living wage**.

Curbside Market

increases the **access and affordability of healthy foods** through a mobile market.









More ways we address food insecurity ...

Lexington Ave. **Community Farm**

provides a growing space for the meals daily for children in refugee population in NW Rochester, and space for Foodlink to grow food for its many programs.

Foodlink Community Kitchen

prepares thousands of healthy Rochester, trains culinary apprentices, and slices & sells NYS-grown apples to schools and other institutions.

Advocacy Agenda

outlines policies and issues – not all directly food related – that impact a household's ability to put food on the table. The document guides our discussions with our elected officials.

How we engage with schools

SCHOOL PANTRIES

- Kids are at their best and can reach their true potential ONLY if they are well nourished.
- Foodlink has strategically developed more partnerships with schools and local colleges.
- We have 19 current School Pantry partners (RCSD, Greece, R-H, etc), and 10 more are in the works.
- In addition, 5 college pantries are in our network (UR, MCC, GCC, Alfred)




How we engage with libraries

MEAL SITES!

- The Rochester Summer Meals program helps connect kids with FREE, healthy meals during the summer months – a critical time of year
- Foodlink & its partners always try to increase participation ... began engaging with libraries 3-4 years ago
- Also important partners during pandemic, as host sites for Grab-and-Go meals
