Hands Up! American Sign Language for Library Staff


- → Six-week virtual series for beginners

- → Registration is open on LibCal









Windows 10 is reaching End of Support in October 2025

- After this date Windows 10 computers will not receive security updates
- It is critical that all computers are upgraded to Windows
 11 by the end of 2025
- We will work with libraries to get eligible computers upgraded



Computers older than about 5 years can't upgrade to Windows 11

- These must be replaced by the end of 2025
- 182 computers in the system purchased in 2017 or earlier that will not support Windows 11
- 100 more computers purchased in 2018 and many will not support Windows 11



What to do about Unsupported Computers

- Identify computers that need to be replaced
 - Use email sent by Kelsy to help identify
 - We can generate inventory lists for most libraries
- Split purchases across 2023, 2024 and 2025
 - Try not to upgrade all at once to avoid this happening again in the future
 - Libraries that have good 5 year replacement plans can just stick with their current replacement schedule and will have no issues



What to do... Continued

- Purchase through OWWL
 - Computers must have the Pro version of Windows for Active Directory and future single sign on
 - Pricing is under New York State contract and deeply discounted
 - We purchase, configure, install and migrate data for free



Microsoft Office Activations

- You only get 50 activations when you buy Office
- Many older licenses (2016) have burned most or all of the activations
- Mostly a problem for midsize to large libraries
- We will not be able to install Office on new computers if the activations are used up



Microsoft Office 2021 is the latest version of Office available from Tech Soup

- Expires October 13, 2026
- Recommend only buying for Staff computers IF you are out of activations or running Office 2013 or older
- Cloud is the Future (Actually Present)
- Promote Office online or Google Docs for patrons
 - Office Online shortcut already on public computers



Microsoft 365 is the Future

- Office brand is being phased out
- This is a subscription model
- Not an appropriate solution for patrons
- Looking at options to move the system to Microsoft 365 in 2026
