### Discussion

- Kanopy Kids overview with Katherine Reidner
  - Video streaming service: Kanopy.com/en/owwl
  - Soft launch has started
  - Log into the youth side by clicking KIDS in bold at top right corner
  - Read along books (Vooks), TV shows, Movie shorts
  - Search features, tags, Spanish language, public performance rights, closed caption
  - Can create watchlists
  - Select parental controls: PIN enabled
    - Recommended that caregivers/parents set up their kids' profiles with a PIN or they will have access to all the content
  - Marketing materials: see website to print your own
  - Check out Katherine's favorite Super Tato from the BBC or search 'beloved characters'
  - Look for video of November 16<sup>th</sup> training on OWWL Docs
- Bonus HOT Tip from Katherine: request Libby promotional box from Overdrive
  - ➤ VOX Book/Wonder Books Discussion

Feedback from owning libraries (Honeoye, Victor, Warsaw, Williamson)

- High circulation
- Shelved in front facing bins or store & circulate with hanging bags (but they frequently get returned without bag)
- Keep a charge a long time
- Loan with<u>out</u> the charging cord (Uses a standard USB)
- Charge them upon check in
- Add an alert in the holdings record that says "upon check in, charge it"
- Tip: Put a label on the book that notifies patron of replacement cost.
  - E.g., "This book costs \$\_\_\_\_ should it get damaged or lost"
- Circulate through delivery
- Recommend not being allowed to return via drop box (increases rate of damage, particularly water)
- At one library, patrons have developed an unofficial challenge to check out/read all their Vox books
  - ❖ Notes re: *Vox* (Victor, Williamson, & Honeoye)
    - Adding chapter books collection
    - Diverse collection
    - Some bilingual offerings
    - Hold up well
  - Notes re: Wonderbooks (Warsaw has both)
    - Large print available
